









### Ready, Set, PLAY!!!














FIG. TRASSUSIATION OF THE LATE OF THE SECOND I

















## 10 ne-to-G0

- Time statistics are collected



























### CCIV
















FIG. TRASPICIATION OF THE PLAT OF SHALL IN A



#### Pet Therapy












#### Rehab Department






